The % of Athens households without health insurance has increased since 2016 and access to primary care, mental care, dental care, and SUD treatment has increased since 2019.

BARRIERS TO ACCESS

MENTAL CARE

- 53% could not afford cost
- 29% did not know where to go
- 22% insurance did not cover cost

SUD TREATMENT

- 34% not ready to stop using alcohol/drugs
- 32% had no coverage & could not afford cost

PRIMARY CARE

- 32% never found provider
- 23% had insurance turned away
