YOUTH BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Athens-Clarke County experienced a significant increase in behavioral and mental health issues among youth.

The problem has been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic, severe workforce shortages, and an overall lack of resources for children.




Children who have experienced an adverse childhood experience (ACE) are much more likely to have mental health disorders and illicit substance use.
